

Tell Legislators Not to Balance the Budget on the Backs of Boaters & Suppliers

The Recreation Boating Association of Washington (RBAW) continues to fight the good fight in the 2025 Washington State Legislative Session. RBAW is asking boaters to call their Legislator to stop the Washington State Senate from passing an eleventh hour new luxury tax on watercraft, aircraft and RV's and vehicles over \$500,000 and cars over \$50,000.

The first \$500,000 of the purchase price would pay the current sales tax, depending

on where you buy it, of approximately 10%. The amount above \$500,000 would have an additional 10% added. The tax is projected to raised \$90M over six years, not acknowledging proven downside impacts. RBAW needs your help to stop it.

RBAW is asking boaters to contact their legislator(s) immediately about this fastmoving and serious proposal out of Olympia. Call the call the Legislative Hotline at 1-800-562-6000 and tell him/her/they/it of the negative impact of this tax on Washington boaters, marine trades, and maritime businesses. Legislators enacted a luxury tax in the nineties that led to a decrease in boat sales and affected marine jobs and small businesses. It was repealed but it took years for the boating industry to recover. RBAW is coordinating with NMTA and other partners to gather data on how similar taxes have harmed boating industries elsewhere (e.g. British Columbia).

At this writing we are hopeful of continued funding for the Lake Bay Marina renewal, "Mind the Zone" on Lake Union, and the Pumpout Washington Project. Revisions to the depreciation schedule governing our annual registration payments will

necessarily await a future legislative session. The good news is that the W' Sound Pump out project will continue with RBAW continued funding to finish building a dedicated pump out vessel. The schedule and intake process will be announced within the next months but is expected to begin before Memorial Day and include Eagle Harbor and Blake

Island. Watch this space. For more information on RBAW's legislative agenda, and/or information about securing a personal membership, log onto rbaw.org.



Vice Commodore's REPORT

Optimism, Patience, Flexibility and Planning

hange is all around us... literally, all around us. Members returning to a newly rebuilt Dock 3 will see significant changes. Waterfront Construction is projected to complete the project by April 17th and the massive WSDOT Skanska 520 project has approached within a few feet of our docks. What needs to be emphasized is the fact that the 520 project will be with us for another six years, till 2031 according to WSDOT.

During that time, the equipment, barges and workboats will occupy areas formerly used by Queen City for member vessel transit and moorage. In the near term we will experience a loss of one or two slips while at the same time making every effort to continue to provide space for reciprocal privileges for visiting clubs. In addition to member moorage space and club reciprocal needs, we have our annual Opening Day requirements for this nearly week long event, that will compound our transition to a new Dock 3.

We are working diligently, in coordination with the Seattle Yacht Club, to minimize the impact of these projects and arrive at a reasonable solution for all concerned.

The work slips have been moved to the outer end of Dock 3 and will be spaced in

such a way as to accommodate boats moored in and between them. Commodore Doug Genord and Past Commodore Scott Grimm are working every conceivable configuration to anticipate the demands that Opening Day places on our club and our members, while explaining this unique, historic, annual extravaganza to Skanska and WSDOT.

The usual rafting and the new work slip configuration will impact the returning displaced members from Dock 3 and will require some flexibility and planning. When displaced boats return on or about April 18th, we will need to anticipate the arrival of visiting boats on April 30th, rafted to the ends of the work slips and sharing the new power pedestals.

Movement in or out will be limited at best, so everyone needs to plan accordingly. This will be an annual routine starting now and lasting through 2031, assuming that this massive highway construction project is completed on time!

That's right, optimism, patience, flexibility and planning are going to be required as we navigate the stresses and changes that will understandably occur, sometimes with little advance warning. And remember,
